

This half term has really flown by! We have some exciting this planned to finish off the half term and lots to look forward to next half term, before the Christmas break. This includes our annual trip to the panto on 26th November, we shall be returning to The Carriageworks Theatre. Thank you to all those that attended the parent forum, do not worry if you cannot attend as I always make sure to put the discussion notes in the newsletter. Moorfield House is coming along nicely – we are currently waiting for inspection, and we will invite you to look around once we are able to. When we are ready to transition classes, this will start slowly and will be discussed with parents/carers prior to this taking place. Our first classes to transition will be Snowy Owl (Y10) and Burrowing Owl (KS3).

Parent Forum meeting notes

Parents wanted to share some lovely feedback for Mr Sangra, highlighting how he has taken the time to get to know the children and their individual personalities. They felt this made for a positive start to the school year and to their children's wider school journey. Parents also expressed their appreciation for the weekly phone calls home. They shared that these regular updates are a great way to stay connected and to celebrate their children and young people's progress each week. Any parents who are not receiving weekly updates should contact the school office.

Parents discussed the importance of getting the settling-in process right when children join from other settings. Some had different experiences, but it was noted that transitions could be smoother if more information about what works for each child including strategies from their previous setting were shared in advance. Mr Brown acknowledged that some young people require a more detailed transition – something which he has planned for future new starters.

Parents raised some questions about consultations between key stages. Mr Brown discussed how Bradford had always used this model which has now been adopted by Leeds and North Yorkshire. When a child is due to move between Primary and Secondary a consultation is made via the local authority. This is to ensure that the school can still meet need and whether Ormston remains the most suitable school. This is usually discussed with Erin Holmes (SENCo) at the EHCP annual review, feel free to reach out to her if you require further information.

As we grow, the carpark will become busier, as young people share transport staggered start times are not possible. As the school grows, we will look at creating a drop off and pick up slot to allow more time and a smoother transition.

At Ormston School we do not mix key stages however we do have some classes with mixed year groups. We try our best to ensure that young people have the right class. We currently have 2 KS2 classes, 1 Year 7 class, 1 mixed Year 7 and 8 class, 1 year 8 class, 1 mixed key stage 3 class and 1 year 10 class. Our next classes that we plan to open are Key Stage 2 in the new year, key stage 3 at Easter and 2 new year 7 classes in September. (Subject to change).

We have planned progress meetings throughout the year so assessment data can be shared with you more regularly. We also have a planned parent forum with our SENCO who will discuss ideas and strategies for supporting learning activities at home.



























As we review our risk assessments and understanding me support plans for young people, we will startoo sharing these with parents and carers and discussing their contents, this will help us to create accurate documents and share key information between school and home.

As we grow our secondary offer and move into the Moorfield House building, we will look to increase our subjects on offer at KS4. Our next appointments will be for Humanities and vocational Teachers. Our KS4 offer booklet can be found on the website, this can also be requested by contacting the school office.

When medication is changed it would be helpful to inform the school office and SENCo. We do have the Leeds NHS Team who visit us throughout the year for key vaccinations, they will contact you in advance to gain permission.

Always practise within a human rights and person-centred framework

Plan and prioritise for the use of primary, secondary and non-restrictive tertiary strategies

As a last resort, only use approved restrictive and non-restrictive practises and techniques

Aim to bring the incident to an end safely \cdot least intrusive \cdot minimum force necessary for the minimum length of time \cdot never against joints \cdot no pain compliance \cdot have regard for gender, medical and cultural needs \cdot use techniques that are biomechanically, anatomically and psychologically assessed

Use reflective practise to change culture and reduce the use of restraint

Post-incident support and debrief; create reflective space \cdot practice with responsibility, account ability and integrity \cdot learn from lived experience \cdot listen to multiple voices within the organisation \cdot acknowledge the strengths of those we work alongside \cdot use data to inform practice \cdot Duty of Candour
