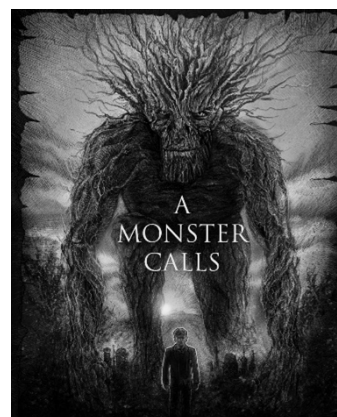

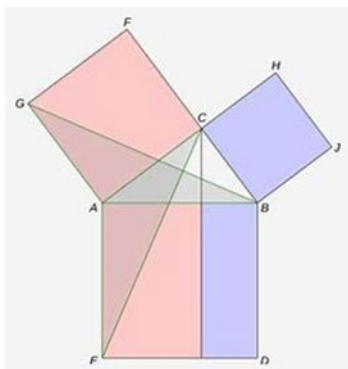

Humanities (History & Geography)

In Key Stage 4 you will explore so many events and key processes that shaped our world and continue to shape the way we think and plan. We will delve into the wars between natives and settlers in the American West, recognise the impact of the Cold War on our world and get amazed with experiments that helped the development of medicine through time. In this journey you will be learning to analyse and interpret historical sources and develop your critical thinking skills building your ability to form reasoned arguments about change, causation, and significance. History is crucial for understanding our present, learning from past mistakes, and shaping our future. It will also strengthen your communication and research skills, which are valuable in careers like law, journalism, and education which is very exciting because we have no idea where you might be 5, 10 or even 30 years from now, but who knows, by then, you may have made your own history.





In Geography we go through some fascinating topics about our natural world.
